Community Council Hires New Executive Director

It's a time of big changes at the District 1 Community Council. Saint Paul's district councils provide neighborhood residents with the opportunity to become involved in city planning. The system is less visible but also facing many changes. District 1 is pleased to announce that it is moving into the future with a new executive director.

"We are delighted to introduce Betsy Mowry Voss as our new Executive Director," said District Council President Paul Sawyer. "Ms. Mowry Voss is a longtime St Paul community leader who brings creativity, management, fundraising, marketing, partnerships, and communications experience – and a positive energy that will be a great help in our community building work." Mowry Voss has worked in a variety of positions including at COMPAS, a nonprofit arts education organization, where she has worked as the Arts Innovation Director, and in other roles, for the past 15 years. Her experience ranges from working with youth, people of color, parks advocates, and women in jail to schools, government, social service and business. She is a past Parks and Recreation Commissioner for the City of Saint Paul, is vicechair of the Ramsey County Extension

Committee, and has served as a grant reviewer for organizations. Mowry Voss is a writer and mosaic artist, and a trained social and racial justice facilitator. She replaces executive director Betsy Leach, who resigned December after a 12-year tenure.

Betsy Mowry Voss says, "My family and I moved to District 1 in 2017 after I lived for 16 years in the Rondo neighborhood. We love this area and I want to be involved in the evolution and positive development of District 1. I work at the intersection of community, education and service, so this job aligns well with my experience and allows me to dig more deeply into community engagement."

"I'm happy to be joining District 1 as the new Executive Director," says Mowry Voss. "Over the next few weeks, I'll be slowly transitioning out of my current position as Arts Innovation Director at COMPAS." Mowry Voss should be in the District office at her full schedule by the end of April.
